## **Head Coaches Report**

The Club has had a successful year both in terms of the qulaity and numbers within the squads growing but also just as importantly in performance results at both team and open competitions.

We now have training sessions that are more often than not very busy, with a great atmosphere for athletes to perfom and train in. Morning sessions are regularly busy with a good mix of age groups from Masters, B squad or Swim Fit squad swimmers in attendance.

Squad places are becoming more and more competitive and will ensure high attendance and hard training is a must to remain in the current squad or have a chance of progressing.

We have successfully intergrated the university swim team into the club, which inturn has raised the standard of training within senior squad and has now made this a very competitive enviorment.

The club has had issues with the introduction of the Leys link, unforseen issues club were not aware of until too late. SLM have agreed that we can take over the Abbey 06.00-08.00, replacing the Leys

The club will continue to look to expand and take on water time when and if it becomes available and if it is financially viable for the club to do so.

### **County Championships**

County Championships statistics again improved but I would like to see us achieving more golds as this was slightly lower than the previous year but over total of medals did rise.

The coaches introduced a buddy competition for the Top and A-squads. Trying to replicate that team spirit that can help improve performances. This was a huge success and was the major talking point of the meet. Most swimmers becoming more interested in the colour of sticker they achieved than the time they swam or gaining feedback from the coach.

## POINTS OF INTEREST

#### Staff costs

- Costs increased during the year to reflect employment of assistant coach (last year the club received a lot of volunteer help during a time we had no assistant coach.
- Administrative help employed this can be pulled back or redirected towards fundraising if more volunteers where available
- Increase pool hours, coaching and introduction of University
  - These factors will alter the relevant lines of income/expenditure in the coming year

## Membership report

#### Current membership levels

- Swimming: 278 members (2011 256, 2010 250, 2009 243, 2008 233)
- Water Polo: 61 members (2011 43, 2010 32, 2009 40, 2008 33)
- Part members: 106 members (2011 96, 2010 100, 2009 96, 2008 97)
- > Total membership > 525
- > Significant membership increase in all areas compared to 2011 AGM.
- > Most squads are full and we have increased capacity at the bottom end.
- > Level of enquiries from potential new members remains high.

#### Validation of details

- > The Constitution requires all members to renew their membership every year
- > ASA have introduced an Online Membership System in 2012.
- > ASA registrations are up to date and we have paid all of our fees on time.

We now have a good squad with a range of abilities and will be able to carry forward the performance levels into next year.


